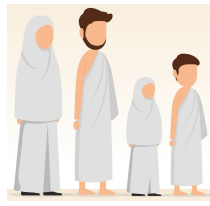


Quick guide to Hajj

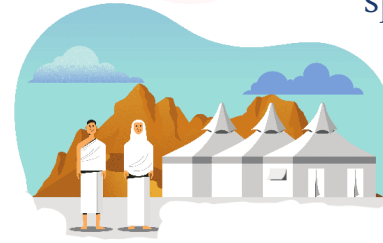

Hajj begins



You will make the intention for Hajj and enter state of Ihram.

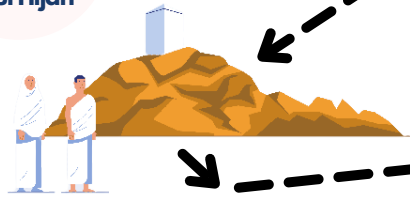

Dhul Hijah



You will make your way to Mina where you will arrive before Dhur and spend the night.

Dhul Hijah



After Fajr salah you will make your way to Arafat, where you will spend the day. You will leave Arafat after sunset without praying your Maghrib salah.

After Sunset (10th Dhul Hijah), you will make your way to Muzdalifah and spend the night. Here you will pray your Maghrib and Isha. You will also collect your pebbles.

Dhul Hijah



Once the process of shaving/trimming your hair is complete, the Ihram can be removed and fresh clothing can be worn after showering. You will then be ready to perform Tawaf al-Ifadah followed by Sa'i (between Safa and Marwa). After completing your Tawaf and Sa'i, you will make your way back to Mina before Fajr time on 10th Dhul Hijah.

Dhul Hijah

After Fajr you will make your way to Jamarah where on this day you will only pelt Jamarah al-Aqaba



The Qurbani ritual (sacrifice of an animal) will then take place. Once the sacrifice is complete, you will shave/trim (Halq/Taqsir) your hair.

Dhul Hijah

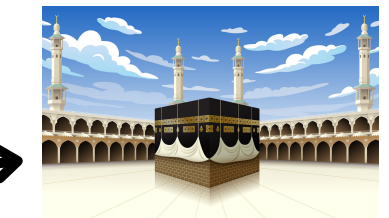
On this day you will do Rami, (pelting of all 3 Jamarah Al-Ula, Al-Wusta & Al-Aqaba), after which you will return back to Mina to spend the night.

Dhul Hijah

On this day you will do Rami, (pelting of all 3 Jamarah Al-Ula, Al-Wusta & Al-Aqaba), after which you will return back to Makkah.



Before leaving Makkah for Madinah or making your return journey home, you will need to perform your farewell Tawaf (Tawaf-Al-Wida)

Pilgrims who are unable to perform Tawaf al Ifadah and Sa'i on the 10th Dhul Hijah, can perform their Tawaf and Sa'i on the 11th or the 12th Dhul Hijah. Some pilgrims may wish to stay in Mina whilst others may wish to return back to Makkah after pelting on the 12th Dhul Hijah. Those who return to Mina will spend an extra night there and leave on the 13th Dhul Hijah. Please note this guide is for information purpose only. The dates are in Hijri
